During a summer birthday party, Helen drove five little girls in her '57 Thunderbird convertible from the southside of Ottawa to Bill's family farm for pony rides.

Helen loved antiques and shopping. She was a firm believer in 'things go better with Coca-Cola.' She loved Coke and had anything advertising Coke.
